Awarded to delegates who excel in performance and engagement throughout the conference is the Outstanding Delegate title. These delegates exhibit high levels of research, persuasive argumentation, active participation in discussions, constructive contribution to the formulation of resolutions, and great diplomatic abilities.

*This award is replaced by "Outstanding Reporter" in the International Press. Delegates who excel at reporting, show a thorough comprehension of international concerns and have a substantial impact on society are recognized with this prize.

Honorable Mention

Delegates who exhibit commendable performance and make a substantial contribution to the debates in their committee are given the Honorable Mention. They participate actively in committee meetings, demonstrate a thorough comprehension of the subject, and work with others to develop workable solutions.

Verbal Mention

Delegates who exhibit commendable performance and make a substantial contribution to the debates in their committee are given the Honorable Mention. They participate actively in committee meetings, demonstrate a thorough comprehension of the subject, and work with others to develop workable solutions.

Best Position Paper

A position paper describes the nation's viewpoint on the subjects on the committee's agenda. Delegates that submit thorough, comprehensive, and persuasive position papers that successfully convey their nation's policies and opinions are recognized with the Best Position Paper award.
